BACKGROUND

This report summarizes the activities of Legislative and Public Affairs for September 2016. The report includes four major areas: Environmental Justice Update; Community Events/Public Meetings (including the Speakers Bureau/Visitor Services, Communications Center, and Public Information Center); Business Assistance; and Outreach to Business and Federal, State and Local Governments.

Environmental Justice Update

The following are key environmental justice-related activities in which staff participated during September 2016. These events involve communities which suffer disproportionately from adverse air quality impacts.

September 1

• The Advisory Council for the Environmental Justice Community Partnership met to plan for the upcoming Environmental Justice for All Conference, taking place on November 16, 2016 at the Center at Cathedral Plaza in Downtown Los Angeles. The Advisory Council discussed possible keynote speakers, panel topics, breakout sessions, and logistics related to the execution of the event.

September 6

 Staff was trained on the state's environmental justice screening tool, CalEnviroScreen 3.0, by the Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment (OEHHA). Staff learned about proposed updates to the tool, which aims to identify areas that fit the definition of environmental justice communities. Staff learned how the tool can be used to improve SCAQMD's environmental justice efforts.

September 7

• Staff participated in the Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC), Exide Advisory Local Government Conference call with representatives from local, state and federal elected officials, and Los Angeles County Department of Public Health. Information on the status of the Exide clean-up was provided by DTSC including more details regarding the clean-up of schools.

September 7

• Staff attended the 2nd California Adaptation Forum in Long Beach, hosted by the Local Government Commission. Staff networked with local, regional, and state leaders who address California's climate adaptation needs, and learned about climate adaptation topics that reflect California's diverse needs and challenges.

September 14

• Staff assisted with outreach, and organized and implemented the logistics for the Proposed Rule 1430 – Control of Toxic Emissions from Grinding Operations at Forging Facilities Working Group meeting in Paramount. The meeting was attended by industry representatives and residents of Paramount.

September 14

Staff presented to County of Riverside Code Enforcement in Palm Desert at the
Desert Permit Assistance Center. In addition to providing background
information on SCAQMD, the discussion focused on illegal dump sites and
Coachella Valley and opportunities to partner where the agencies' jurisdictions
overlap.

September 21

• Staff from three departments, Legislative, Public Affairs & Media; Planning, Rule Development and Area Sources; and Compliance and Enforcement, attended the Coachella Valley Environmental Justice Enforcement Task Force meeting. Air quality was one of many issues discussed at the meeting. The meeting was well attended by representatives from Assembly Member Eduardo Garcia's office, City of Coachella, U.S. EPA Region 9, CARB, Coachella Valley Mosquito and Vector Control District, Regional Water Quality Control Board, and La Union Hace La Fuerza.

September 24

• Staff hosted the "Our Voices, Our Lives, Our Air: A Community Workshop on Air Pollution and Health," as part of the Environmental Justice Community Partnership. The event honored Oscar Rodriguez, Community Organizer for the Oakview ComUNIDAD Group, as a way for community members to learn about the leaders who address environmental justice issues in their community. The event was also an opportunity for community members to express their air quality concerns.

Each year SCAQMD staff engage with thousands of residents, providing valuable information about the agency, incentive programs, and ways individuals can help reduce air pollution through events and meetings sponsored solely by SCAQMD or in partnership with others. - Clean air technologies and their deployment;
- Invitations or notices of conferences, seminars, workshops and other public events;
- SCAQMD incentive programs;
