BACKGROUND

This report summarizes the activities of Legislative and Public Affairs for June and July 2016. The report includes four major areas: Environmental Justice Update; Community Events/Public Meetings (including the Speakers Bureau/Visitor Services, Communications Center, and Public Information Center); Business Assistance; and Outreach to Business and Federal, State and Local Governments.

Environmental Justice Update

The following are key environmental justice-related activities in which staff participated during June and July 2016. These events involve communities which suffer disproportionately from adverse air quality impacts.

June 9

 Staff organized the logistics, conducted outreach and assisted with the Sunshine Canyon Landfill Town Hall Meeting at Van Gogh Charter Elementary School in Granada Hills.

June 15

• Staff participated in the Coachella Valley Environmental Justice Taskforce meeting. A presentation was given by SCAQMD staff on illegal dumping issues in and around Eastern Coachella Valley to multiple agencies as well as other interested parties.

<u>June 16</u>

 Staff organized the logistics and facilitated the joint Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) and SCAQMD Exide Technologies Community Advisory Group meeting at Bishop Mora Salesian High School in Boyle Heights. The meeting focused on the upcoming DTSC CEQA scoping meetings related to the continued residential clean-up in affected communities.

<u>June 21</u>

• Staff met with representatives from Southern California Edison (SCE), to share information about SCAQMD's environmental justice initiatives, and to learn about SCE's efforts to implement electric vehicle chargers in disadvantaged communities.

June 23

Staff organized the logistics and outreach for a meeting under AB 2588 Air
Toxics Hot Spots requirements related to Quemetco, Inc. (City of Industry) at La
Puente High School. The meeting was well attended by over 250 residents and
other interested stakeholders.

June 30

Staff hosted the Environmental Justice Community Partnership event "Our Voices, Our Lives, Our Air: A Community Conversation on Air Pollution and Health." SCAQMD partnered with San Bernardino Valley College, KVCR/NPR 91.9 FM, and the Center for Community Action and Environmental Justice, to improve local community participation.

July 12

• Staff met with a representative from the Delhi Center of Santa Ana, to discuss the possibility of hosting a workshop in the surrounding community, for the Environmental Justice Community Partnership. Participants discussed potential dates, outreach strategies, and topics to address during the community event.

<u>July 26</u>

• Staff attended a community meeting hosted by the California Air Resources Board (CARB) Environmental Justice Committee, regarding the State's Climate Plan. Staff networked with individuals from CARB and multiple environmental justice community groups, including the Physicians for Social Responsibility, Sierra Club, SCOPE, Liberty Hill, and Pacoima Beautiful.

• Staff met with the Environmental Justice Community Partnership Advisory Council, to discuss the possibility of hosting an environmental justice workshop in Orange County. Participants included members of the Delhi Center, Oakview Comunidad Group, and Unite Here Local 11, discussed potential dates, outreach strategies, and topics to address during the community event.

July 28

• Staff attended the 15th Anniversary event for the California Environmental Justice Alliance at the Plaza de Cultura y Artes in Downtown Los Angeles. Staff networked with multiple environmental justice community groups and organizations, as well as elected officials.

SPEAKERS BUREAU/VISITOR SERVICES

SCAQMD also hosts visitors from around the world who meet with staff on a wide range of air quality issues.
