

Andrea Vidaurre

2024 Goldman Environmental Prize Awardee

Andrea Vidaurre (she/her) was born and raised in the unceded territories of the Tongva, also known as the "Inland Empire" of Southern California. She graduated from the University of California, Riverside in Global Studies hoping to pursue global public health but found her place in the environmental justice movement pursuing local public health. In 2020, she and other colleagues helped co-found the Peoples Collective for Environmental Justice, a community-based organization focused on fighting environmental racism and finding solutions through community work. In the past couple of years, she has worked on environmental justice issues throughout the Inland Empire and has helped pass landmark policies that are transforming our freight transportation system to zero emissions. In 2024, she won the Goldman Environmental Prize, an international recognition for her grassroots work.











