



Funding Now Available for Air Filtration Systems at Public Schools Within AB 617 Communities



Funding available to public schools for air filtration installation and maintenance projects



Air filters reduce exposure to particulate matter and other harmful pollutants



Up to \$13.7 million available



Up to 100% of cost covered



Eligible schools must be within an AB 617 community

- Carson West Long Beach
- San Bernardino
 - South Los Angeles
 - Southeast Los Angeles Eastern Coachella Valley

- Eliaibility:
- Must be a public school
- ✓ Must be located within an AB 617 Community
- Must meet federal, state, and local requirements

Applicants must submit:

- A project description, including the number of classrooms, the number and type of filters requested, the use of subcontractors and other information
- A project budget, including the cost of installation, maintenance, and other factors contributing to the project cost
- ✓ A project schedule describing key milestones and completion dates
- **Other** submittal requirements detailed in the program announcement

- On September 6, 2024, the Board approved the AB 617 Public School Air Filtration Program
- Public schools and school districts located within AB 617 Communities and their vendors are eligible to apply for:
 - High Efficiency Particulate Air (HEPA) filtration systems, and
 - Replacement filters



- Up to \$13.7 million in Community Air Protection incentive funds is available for the installation and/or maintenance of HEPA filtration systems
- Staff has conducted outreach to eligible school districts and vendors
- Applications are due by 3 pm on December 20, 2024
- Staff anticipates to begin awarding contracts in Spring of 2025

Climate Pollution Reduction Grant INVEST CLEAN



- Inflation reduction act (IRA) created \$4.6 B U.S. EPA Climate Pollution Reduction Grant Program (CPRG)
- \$500 million award to the South Coast AQMD
- INVEST CLEAN Infrastructure, Vehicles, and Equipment Strategy for Climate, Equity, Air Quality, and National Competitiveness
- Develop climate action plans and implement projects to:
 - Reduce air pollution
 - Support jobs
 - GHG emission reductions and community benefits
 - Address environmental justice





OIL WELLS IN YOUR COMMUNITY





AIR MONITORING ACTIVITIES NEAR OIL WELLS

- Area wide mobile monitoring with enforcement team support
- Identify locations with enhanced Volatile Organic Compounds (VOCs) concentrations

Area Surveys

Source Identification

 Identification of emission sources through investigative monitoring

- Use Forward Looking InfraRed (FLIR) camera and Toxic Vapor Analyzers (TVA) to investigate for leaks
- Facilities fixed leaks (staff verified)

Enforcement

OIL WELLS AIR MONITORING IQOLBOX







VOC

Optical Remote Sensing Mobile Laboratory:

Used for surveys, hotspot identification, and/or concentration mapping of air toxic pollutants

Forward Looking Infrared Camera (FLIR):

Used to visualize emissions and field investigations

Toxic Vapor Analyzer:

Used to monitor for hydrocarbons and verify compliance and investigate complaints






