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Draft Interim Removal Action Workplan for Former Diesel Logistics

South Coast Air Quality Management District (South Coast AQMD) staff appreciates the opportunity to provide comments on the above-mentioned document. Based on the Community Update, the Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) is proposing to install and operate a soil vapor extraction (SVE) system to clean up soil contaminated with trichloroethylene (TCE) and tetrachloroethylene (PCE) from a former diesel engine repair facility site (Site). The Site is located at 1331 E. Warner Avenue, Santa Ana, CA.

Since the proposed remedial actions would involve the installation and use of a SVE system, complete and timely permit applications for a Permit to Construct and a Permit to Operate for the SVE system will be required under South Coast AQMD Rule 201 – Permit to Construct¹ and Rule 203 – Permit to Operate².
