Executive Order 25-01(b)

WHEREAS, the Governor's January 7, 2025 proclamation declaring a State of Emergency for the County of Los Angeles remains in effect; and

WHEREAS, I find that the conditions justifying Executive Order 25-01 regarding operation of emergency standby engines beyond the 200-hour annual limit set forth in their South Coast AQMD permits continue to exist in the County of Los Angeles; and

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority vested in me pursuant to South Coast AQMD Rule 118(d)(1), I hereby extend Executive Order 25-01 for an additional 10 days, suspending applicable sections of Rules 203(b), 1110.2(i)(B), 1303, 1304(a)(4), 1401, 1401.1, and 2005(k)(5), and any other rules or permit conditions limiting hours of operation of emergency internal-combustion engines operated in the County of Los Angeles, to the extent such engines are used to provide emergency power or to combat the wildfires. Any usage during the period of suspension will not be counted when calculating and determining compliance with any applicable annual limitations on hours of operation of the engines. Engine operators shall maintain hourly records of all engine usage, including usage and the date of usage under this Order. All other terms and conditions of the permit and other air quality rule requirements will remain in full force and effect.

This order shall expire at 11:59 p.m. on February 6, 2025, unless further extended by Executive Order pursuant to Rule 118.
