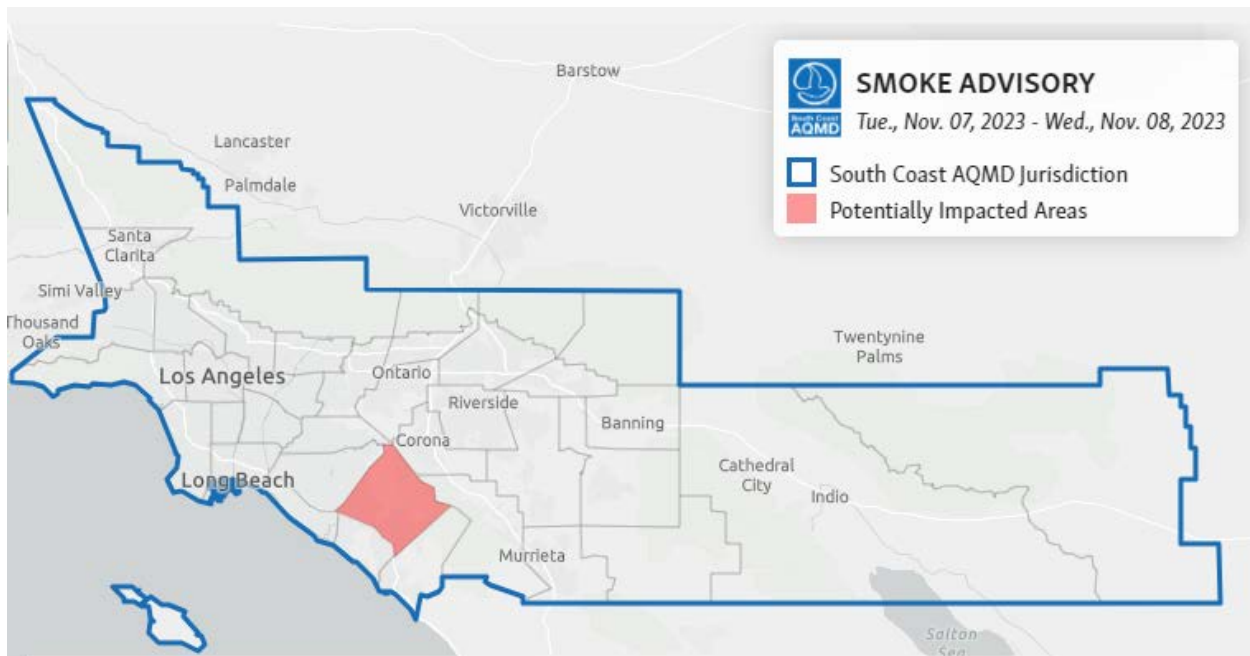

South Coast AQMD Issues a Smoke Advisory for a Hangar Fire at the Former Tustin Air Base

Valid: Tuesday 10:00 a.m. until Wednesday 11:59 p.m.

Forecasted Smoke and Air Quality Impacts

- A large hangar located in Tustin continues to burn slowly.

- Updates about the fire can be found on the [Orange County Fire Authority 'X' - formerly Twitter - page](#)
- Most smoke impacts are localized at present, with light to moderate winds expected the rest of Tuesday
- Air quality conditions may reach **Unhealthy for Sensitive Groups** in nearby neighborhoods
- Strong Santa Ana winds are expected Wednesday morning onward, potentially pushing any remaining smoke toward the southwest

If you are in an area impacted by windblown dust or ash:

- Limit your exposure by remaining indoors with windows and doors closed or seeking alternate shelter.
- Avoid vigorous physical activity.
- Run your air conditioning and/or an air purifier. If possible, do **not** use swamp coolers or whole house fans that bring in outside air.
- Avoid burning wood in your fireplace or firepit and minimize sources of indoor air pollution such as candles, incense, pan-frying, and grilling.
- If you must be outside, a properly fit N95 or P100 respirator may provide some protection.
