



South Coast AQMD is Conducting Rulemaking that Could Impact Your Home Water Heaters and Furnaces

The rules will reduce emissions from residential furnaces (Rule 1111) and water heaters (Rule 1121) by transitioning to zero-emission appliances.

How Will the Rules Impact You?

Rules will take effect in 2-5 years and will be required only when:

Appliances are voluntarily replaced



Existing appliances break



Will There be any Flexibility?

Exceptions will be allowed for:



Construction or utility upgrades delays



High-altitude areas



Owners of multifamily buildings





Considering other circumstances

Health Benefits

Once implemented, these rules will prevent:

 **4,000** premature deaths

 **16,000** cases of newly onset asthma

 **4,000** emergency room visits

Will Financial Assistance be Available?

South Coast AQMD is working on an incentive program to provide rebates for residents, building owners and small businesses.
