To Whom It May Concern,

In advance of the South Coast Air Quality Management District Governing Board's upcoming vote on August 2nd, I am writing to strongly urge you to pass a rule to reduce pollution from freight rail yards. As a longtime Southern California resident, I am extremely concerned about excessive pollution and poor air quality that is directly related to unchecked and unregulated industries.

The Indirect Source Review Rule (PR 2306) will help us clean up the worst polluters in the smoggiest air basin in the country.
